The Reverend Donald Logan passed into rest, Saturday, October 15, 2016 at the Ogeechee Area Inpatient Facility after a brief illness. Rev. Logan was born in Philadelphia Pennsylvania where he received his former education and was very active in his community and church. He later enlisted in the United States Air Force. Upon retiring he continued his commitment to his country in the U.S. Air Force Reserves as well as the U.S. Army reserves as a chaplain's assistant.

Rev. Logan studied Practical theology at the Bible Institute, Plymouth, Florida and was a graduate to the International Seminary College. He was also passionate in spreading God's word with those at the Orchard Manor Rehabilitation Center in Pulaski, Georgia which was called the Evans County Church of God at Orchard Manor Rehabilitation Center. Rev. Logan also worked diligently in many other church and civic organizations with in Statesboro, Georgia. He was employed with the Green Way Shuttle Bus Company until his health failed and was a member of the Tuskegee Airmen. He was a faithful member of the Elm Street Church of God.
